SLS1501 – College Study Success Skills

Instructors

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Course Description

This is an introductory college skills course. We will be looking at how to be successful in college. This includes a number of topics including: taking notes, studying tips, how to be come a better writer, information about the UF Honor Code, writing a resume, interviewing, and how to pick a major.

Course Outcomes

This is a general study skills course that will teach and review techniques that will help you become a successful college student. The course emphasizes developing critical thinking, reading, and writing skills. Additionally, students will learn about resources available at the University of Florida, academic integrity, and best practices for studying and learning.

Course Goals and Objectives

This course will help you:

- 1. Identify your academic strengths and weaknesses and your preferred learning style
- 2. Manage your time more effectively and efficiently
- 3. Become a better listener and note taker
- 4. Become a better reader and writer
- 5. Plan, draft, revise, edit, and proofread an essay
- 6. Examine material critically
- 7. Begin thinking about your career by developing a resume
